

College Ready & Dual Enrollment

Advanced Academic - Students may complete an Advanced Academic Pathway when four credits from English Language Arts, Mathematics, Science, or Social Studies have been successfully completed. The student's chosen Academic Pathway must include at least one Advanced Placement Course, or one Dual-Enrollment Course that fulfills a core graduation requirement in the subject area of the selected pathway. Two units of sequential course credits in one World Language are also required.

Move On When Ready is Georgia's new Dual Enrollment program that allows high school students (9th - 12th grade) to earn college credit while working on their high school diploma. The Move On When Ready Program now covers tuition, mandatory fees, and required textbooks. Students take postsecondary coursework for credit towards both high school graduation or home study completion and postsecondary requirements. Students at the School of Liberal Studies @ Savannah High will be counseled on Move On When Ready options as it relates to their chosen career pathways.

HOPE - Helping Outstanding Pupils Educationally - is Georgia's unique scholarship and grant program that rewards students with financial assistance in degree, diploma, and certificate programs at eligible public and private colleges, universities, and public technical colleges in Georgia. Since the HOPE Program began in 1993, over \$6.4 billion in HOPE funds have been awarded to more than 1.5 million students attending Georgia's colleges, universities, and technical colleges. Students at the Career Academy East @ Savannah High School will learn about the HOPE program and eligibility.

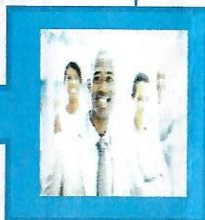

Career Exploration Programs

Quality Education through Student Tours and Training

QUEST is a program offered through the Office of College & Career Readiness (OCCR). Students who apply will have the opportunity to explore careers and participate in career related activities. In partnership with local business and industry, QUEST helps students gain workplace knowledge and competencies, through field trips, guest speakers, industry tours and more.

Exploring is a unique career exploration program for young men and women. This program provides students with an opportunity to learn about a wide variety of career fields and network with professionals already working in those fields. Exploring teaches the value of leadership and character development as well as gives students hands-on experiences in career fields of interest.

Work-Based Learning Programs (WBL) are structured experiences that connect the student's career goal and classroom learning with a productive work environment. Work-Based Learning includes student placement that may be paid or unpaid positions.

Work-Based Learning provides students with opportunities for instruction not only in academics but also in occupational skills, career exploration, and guidance in identifying employment and educational goals. Students have the opportunity to connect what they learn in school with work-site application, enabling a smooth transition into the work force and/or education beyond high school.

Youth Apprenticeship is a structured combination of school-based and work-based learning. Through a coordinated effort involving business and industry, Youth Apprenticeship addresses the dual role of preparing students for the world of work and providing Georgia with a highly skilled, technologically competitive workforce. A student participating in the Youth Apprenticeship Program receives an education that is both academically challenging and relevant to employment in today's economy. The program enables a student to receive a high school diploma, a post-secondary certificate or degree, and certification of industry-recognized competencies applicable to employment in a high-skilled occupation.
